Today is a day of celebration and we hope you enjoy yourselves very much. We also hope your final assessments go very well. It's not over yet!


I'll finish with a quote from Neil Gaiman.

STEM GIRLS PROGRAM

Last term the five of us participated in the UniSA STEM girls program. It consisted of two workshop days in Mount Gambier and a trip to Adelaide. In Mount Gambier, we collaborated with other local girls learning skills within STEM focusing on Firework Functions and Career Exploration, and Biomechanics in Sport. In Adelaide, all the girls participating in the program from around the state met at a networking dinner in Mawson Lakes. Before the dinner, we were involved in a workshop designed to give us skills useful in networking and meeting new people. We were fortunate to hear from three influential female guest speakers who have careers in STEM fields.

The following day we were given the opportunity to visit several different industries. This included DST (Defence, Science, Technology group) which is part of the Department of Defence for Australia, the UniSA Health and Innovation building where ground -breaking cancer research is taking place and Rising Sun Pictures, an Australian Visual Effects Company that works on films such as Thor: Ragnarok, Gravity, The Wolverine, just to name a few. To finish the day we visited MOD (The Museum of Discovery) a futuristic museum incorporating art, science and technology together; there were interactive exhibits using virtual reality, thought provoking exhibits and immersive interactive displays too.

This incredible experience opened our eyes to future career opportunities in the STEM field.







TIMMS

A Year 8 class has been selected to take part in the Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study (TIMSS). TIMSS is an important educational research project investigating student achievement in mathematics and science. More than 60 countries, including Australia, are participating in this study. TIMSS is an important activity to keep us, as parents and citizens, informed about how our students in Australia are performing in comparison to their peers in other countries and to compare programs of study and teaching practices. We will be able to obtain current national and international information which will help improve the teaching and learning of mathematics and science in our country.

Selected students will do an assessment in mathematics and science and complete a questionnaire about their experiences at home and school. There is no need for students to study specifically for the assessment as it will not affect individual students' grades or progress in school.

All data will be kept strictly confidential and no individual student or school will be identified in published data or reports.
