



This directly supports the language revival work that has been done by the Committee and demonstrates pride and respect for the Country on which Grant High School is located. In order to create the signs we had to follow a process of consultation including submitting an application for approval by the Committee, working with Elders, community members and linguist Professor Barry Blake to establish the translations and then recording their pronunciation in order to develop QR codes to assist our audience with understanding how the phrases are pronounced. Many thanks to Scott McCulloch for his help with the QR codes and to Ben and Jake from Brumby's Signs for their wonderful work.
