#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

#### **Dear Families**

This will be the last newsletter of the term - it is amazing how quickly the last ten weeks have gone. No doubt, many of our young people are looking forward to a holiday after a very busy term full of academic commitments, great sporting moments and numerous cultural events.

Week 9 was one of hosting various dignitaries as we welcomed His Excellency, Hui Van Le AC, the Governor of South Australia on Wednesday. It was a pleasure to have him talk to our current and potential exchange students about the value of travelling overseas and becoming immersed in other cultures. He also presented us with a reciprocal gift from our sister school in Japan, Soja Minami High School. This comprised a Japanese fan and a letter from my counterpart in Japan.

Then on Thursday, we conducted the opening of our STEM build, which was officiated over by local Member of the South Australian Parliament, Troy Bell. It was fabulous to be able to host a tour where everyone saw their hard work in action as students used the fantastic new facility.

Meetings are again underway for the new Capital Works Program that will make us Year 7 -ready. We remain on track to provide a new gym and performing arts space, as well as some expansions in other areas, to ensure we

are able to provide the best possible facilities to all of our students, while accommodating a new year level. We also continue to work hard on ensuring our educational practice will cater for all of our students.



After some training sessions and our own Athletics Carnival, the Grant High School Athletics team had their first hit out for the year in Bordertown High School at the 75th annual SESSSA Interschool Athletics Competition. Despite some late withdrawals from the team and an early start to the day (6.15am), Grant High fielded a talented squad filled with enthusiastic athletes.

The team started off the day in excellent form with Skye Millard trouncing the competition with a dominant display in the under 14 shot put. Grant High students also lit up the track in the sprint events with Bonnie Camm and Ella Simmonds winning the Under 15 & 16 female 100m / 200m events. Sam McTaggart led all the way to win the Under 16 boys 400m.

Our field event athletes also competed strongly throughout the day with Kirra Schultz and Keyarnah Smith showing their strength in all three of the throwing events. James Allen also had an impressive day winning events on the track and in the field.

Overall, every team member contributed to a very successful day, with our school taking home more place ribbons than in the past few years. At the conclusion of the day Grant High finished 4th overall after a close battle with Bordertown High School and Tenison Woods College for 2nd spot.

I was extremely pleased with the enthusiasm, behaviour and team spirit that all of our athletes displayed on the day. A special mention must go to Makala Cookson, Kirra Schultz, Ryan Larsen and Isabelle Ladner who picked up new events at the last minute. Our team now continues their training in preparation for the SSSSA Athletics Championships which will be held at Santos Stadium in Adelaide on the 10th of April. #### **NAPLAN**

NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy. It is important to remember that NAPLAN is not about passing or failing, but about assessing learning progress. At the classroom level it is one of a number of important tools used by teachers to measure student progress. NAPLAN tests also provide schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are meeting important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy

All students in Year 9 are expected to participate in the annual NAPLAN tests. Students with disability may qualify for adjustments that reflect the support normally provided for classroom assessments. Where applicable, you should first discuss the use of any disability adjustments for your child with your child's teacher.

A formal exemption may be granted for a student with significant intellectual disability and/or significant coexisting conditions, please contact your student's Community Leader to discuss this.




