FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Families,

We are nearly at the end of the semester, which means examinations are about to take place for some Year 10, 11 and 12 classes. All other students are completing final assessments to allow us to finalise grades before the end of term. Reports will be made available in Week 10, and we encourage all parents and caregivers to access these through the portal, so that you can discuss results with your young people and set them up for further or greater success in Semester 2.

Wild Winter's Night was a fabulous success last Friday, with a huge crowd in attendance. We congratulate all students who took the opportunity to showcase their skills in performance and food and hospitality at this event. We also thank Pariya Ziakas and the amazing Arts faculty for their initiative in ensuring our students continue to get these unique opportunities to shine.

Negotiations are continuing around our Capital Works program. In order to be Year 7-ready, it appears that we will need to forgo a new gym at this stage. We really need many more teaching spaces, as we are

already near capacity and will not otherwise be able to cater for Year 7s, by 2022, when they will be joining secondary school ranks. This priority has sadly outweighed the need for a new gym and we will be focusing on the Performing Arts spaces as well as increasing our ability to accommodate more Science and Visual Arts classes as the main goals of the new build. It is envisaged that we will be in the design phase for the remainder of this year.

Course Counselling is now underway for 2020. It was terrific to see some families at the Course Counselling Expo last week and we encourage everyone to access the Course Booklet through Sentral in order to make the best-informed choices for next year. Please ensure your young person makes their preliminary choices online before the deadline early in Term 3, as these choices will determine the 2020 line structure and the availability of subjects.


VIRTUAL REALITY EXPERIENCE








STUDENT ABSENCES

YEAR 10 MATHS EXAMINATION GUIDELINES

Students will be dismissed from homegroup early and will need to meet on the Senior Floor at 11:05 quietly and wait to be seated.

Attendance at exams is **COMPULSORY**.

If students are absent from exams with a suitable explanation and make contact with the school either prior to or on the day of the exam, then alternative arrangements will be made to re-sit the exam. If no contact is made with the school as outlined above then students will receive a zero mark, which will then be recorded on semester reports.

Subject teachers will call home and notify parents/caregivers when students do not attend exams.

- All students sitting exams should be in school uniform.
- Mobile phones are not to be taken into exams. They cannot be used as calculators or timers.
- MP3 players or electronic dictionaries are not to be taken into exams.
- Students are allowed and encouraged to bring water or other non-carbonated drinks to the exam.
- Students who require extra materials can gain the invigilator's attention by raising a hand.
- Students must ask the invigilator for permission before getting up from their seats for any reason.
- Year 10 students will be required to remain in the exam room for the duration of the exam.
- Students are to leave their script books/exams on their tables for the invigilator to collect.
- At the conclusion of the exam, students should place any paper in the recycling bins provided and other rubbish in the bin.
